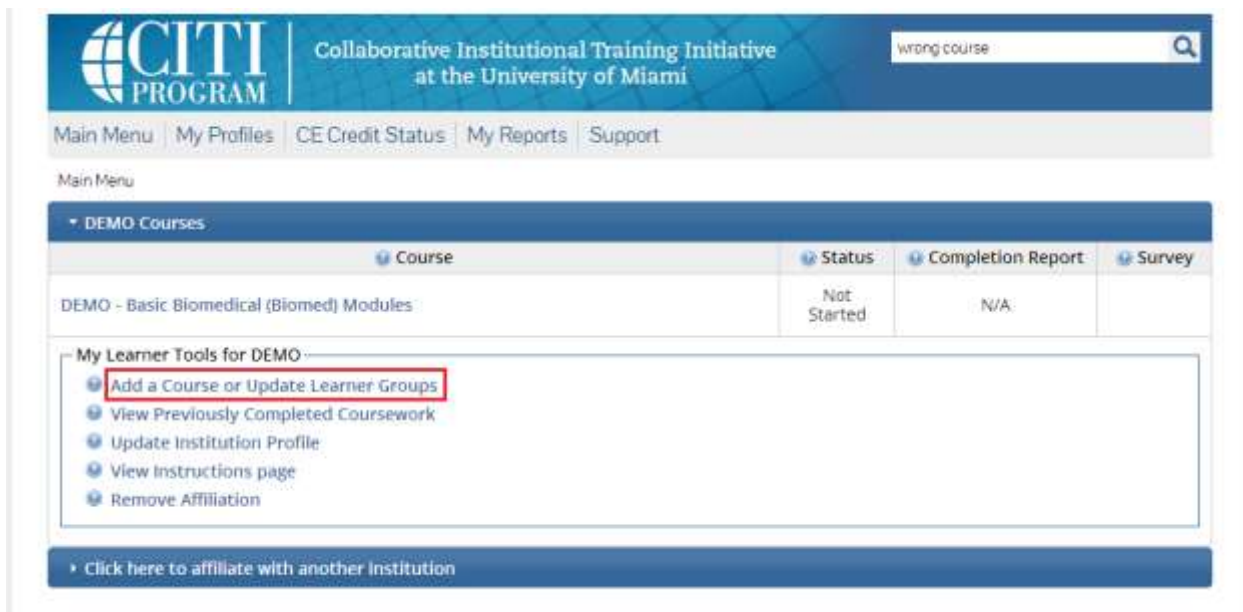


## Biosafety Training Instructions

1. Go to [www.citiprogram.org](http://www.citiprogram.org). From the homepage you will find the log in box to the right of the screen.
2. Log in with your existing CITI Program username and password.  
*If you have forgotten your username or password you can retrieve them through the "Forgot Username or Password" link.*
3. If you are new to CITI, click 'register' to create a new account. When completing your registration profile, be sure to affiliate with **Oklahoma State University Center for Health Sciences**. For further guidance on completing your registration profile, go [here](#).



4. Under the Main Menu Tab, click on "Add a Course or Update Learner Groups."



5. On the next page, you are presented with several questions to answer to identify which courses are most applicable to your role. The last question focuses on your role in biosafety.
  - If you are a student or staff, please select “Initial Biosafety training”
  - If you are a faculty member, please select “Initial Principal Investigator training for faculty”
  - Institutional Biosafety Committee Member training is for IBC members only

Then, click “submit” at the bottom of the page

6. After you make your course selections, you will be brought to the Main Menu. Click on the blue bar for your Oklahoma State University Center for Health Sciences courses. You should then see your Course list, as well as your Learner Tools for the institution.

Click on the title of the course to be brought to the module list for the course. Review the requirements of your course, then proceed to **Complete the Integrity Assurance Statement**.

After agreeing to the Integrity Assurance Statement, the first module will become available to enter.

**Required Modules** will become available as you complete them in the order presented.

**Elective Modules** (if applicable) would become available all at once and may be taken in any order.

Complete the required modules and any associated quizzes. Once you complete the course, you are able to save your CITI completion report as a Microsoft Word document or a PDF file. Print your completion report and keep a copy for your records. Also, forward a copy to your supervisor/mentor.

80% is a passing score. **Refresher biosafety training will be required every 3 years.**

## **FAQs**

### **Can I complete a CITI Program course in multiple sessions?**

Once you have logged out of the system, your completed module will be saved and you can return to the same place in the course when you choose to return to it. This way you will be able to complete an entire course in a series of sessions.
